IN THE MATTER OF LIFTING THE APRIL 2, 2020, EXECUTIVE ORDER THAT
INSTITUTED A JUVENILE "STAY AT HOME ORDER" WITHIN THE
UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF SALINE COUNTY, ARKANSAS

WHEREAS, in Executive Order EO 20-03 the Governor of the State of Arkansas declared an emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic which has spread to the state of Arkansas which has been extended by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, on or about April 2, 2020, I, acting as County Judge for Saline County, Arkansas, issued an Executive Order instituting a juvenile "stay at home order" within the unincorporated areas of Saline County, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, the Governor is presently loosening certain restrictions within the state in order to gradually return Arkansas to its state prior to the spread of COVID-19 to our area of the country.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JEFF AREY, acting under my authority as County Judge for Saline County, Arkansas, do hereby lift my April 2, 2020 Executive Order which instituted a juvenile "stay at home order" pursuant to A.C.A. §12-75-101, et seq. Acting under this authority, I do hereby declare the following using the emergency powers conferred upon me as County Judge:

The juvenile "stay at home order" for all minors within the unincorporated areas of Saline County which took effect at 12:01 am, Monday April 6, 2020, pursuant to the Executive Order issued on April 2, 2020, is hereby lifted. Juveniles within the unincorporated areas of Saline County may participate in, including travel to and from, any activities allowed pursuant to the orders, proclamations, or directives issued by the Governor of the State of Arkansas or the Arkansas Department of Health; and Juveniles participating in such activities shall follow all directives of the Governor and the Arkansas Department of Health as they relate to the COVID-19 pandemic.
